Dear Colleagues,

Across the globe, consumers stayed home and factories shuttered production, resulting in demand and supply shocks that have led to profound economic and social disruption.

Underlying political, social, and economic schisms between nations, as well as allies, quickly became apparent hindering the timely and effective response to the pandemic. Global and regional superpowers were shaken, and the leaders of some of the strongest nations looked weak and were even accused of having failed their peoples.

Leadership competence and accountability in these times is critical, not only on the political level, but at the community and business levels as well. The challenges of leading through a global shared trauma has exposed the limitations of leaders and business managers alike, as crises tend to bring out the best and worst in individuals.

In the Middle East and Africa region, the pandemic has further exacerbated pre-existing fault lines, particularly geopolitical tensions, and contributed to the dual shock of a massive drop in global oil demand and a resulting oversupply. With volatility remaining high within the oil & gas sector, bankruptcies will undoubtedly increase, and one can expect continued consolidation in the sector and accelerated mergers & acquisitions.

During these unprecedented and tumultuous times, the Edgo board and management team have maintained three key principals, which are to: protect our employees, support our communities, and fortify the group's finances.

The health and wellbeing of Edgo's employees and their families was and remains the number one priority. Within the communities we work in, Edgo has proudly been at the forefront of companies aiding and supporting through financial donations as well as medical PPE and foodstuffs. The building of social capital through philanthropy has always been one of Edgo's central core values. As the dust settles and economic activity returns, Edgo, like its peers, will need to ensure financial resiliency given the expected state of volatility and protracted economic malaise.

We will need to identify and squeeze out inefficiencies in our working environment by introducing more automation, machine learning, etc. We must acknowledge the hard decisions and issues we are all confronting, and, occasionally, we will need to make difficult decisions in ambiguous situations.

While playing defensive since the crisis began, Edgo has also been on the offensive searching for potential nuggets. During the past several months, the Edgo teams have been busy evaluating and/or bidding on several sizeable acquisition opportunities. One opportunity, where we have now advanced to the sound stage, involves the takeover of an internationally recognized company which was employing ten thousand employees just prior to the pandemic.

Edgo will need to pivot, continue to selectively invest, and improve the agility of the group in order to better protect against future dangers. We have constructed Edgo so it can thrive in harsh environments and survive extraordinary circumstances. We must always be mindful of what can go wrong but focus on increasing the chances of things going right. As we all continue to engage in balancing crisis containment, we must reimagine a better future.

The Edgo Group Helps in The Fight Against The Pandemic

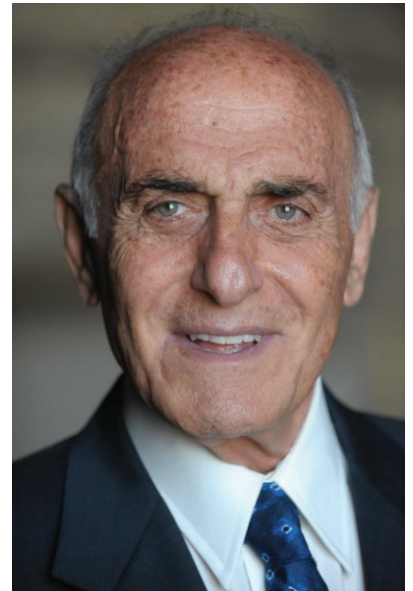
The Edgo Group has been helping in the fight against coronavirus in different areas of the region.

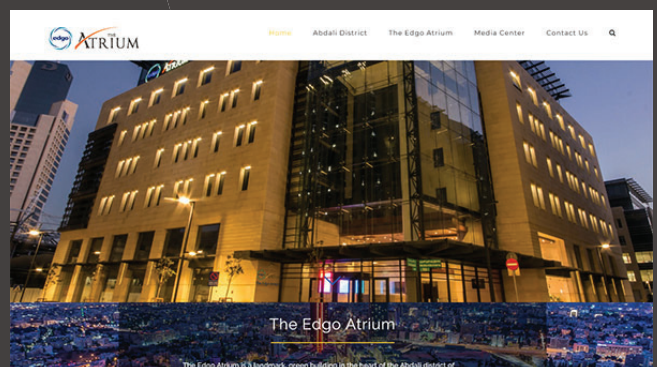

ESP Limited Awarded First Contract with Sirte Oil Company

ESP Limited, the exclusive channel partner of Baker Hughes in Libya, has been awarded a major tender with Sirte Oil Company (SOC).

The contract covers one of the first projects to install electric submersible pumps for SOC. Having previously used gas lift technology, SOC has contracted ESP Limited to convert ten wells from gas lifting technology to ESPs to ensure they are using the most efficient and reliable lifting technology.

The ESP Limited team has designed the pumps using the Baker Hughes design software, AutographPC, to ensure optimum production. The project consists of procuring, installing, commissioning and optimizing the complete pump system. Each system consists of a full downhole ESP string with Zenith gauges and a variable speed drive with an option to deploy remote surveillance and control. This will allow SOC to remotely control the wells, switch them on and off and increase and decrease production without having to send a technician to the wellsite.

ESP Limited is delighted to be introducing Baker Hughes' ESP technology to the Sirte Oil Company to help them achieve their production targets.

Camco Completes Openhole Logging Job in Libya

Despite the current difficulties related to the coronavirus pandemic, and on-going security challenges, the Camco Wireline services team has successfully completed an onshore, open-hole logging job in Libya's Sirte Basin.

Using Camco's standalone, complete logging package, which was requested by the client, the job was the first completed by Camco's Wireline team since 2010. The job was executed with excellent data quality and performance from engineers and real-time support and follow up by Camco's Geoscience team from Camco's head office in Tripoli.

Following the successful completion of the job to tight deadlines, despite the present, very challenging situation, the Camco Wireline team is looking forward to continuing to expand its open-hole Wireline logging operations in Libya.



ESP Ltd Successfully Install the First Pump in Bouri Field After Ten Years

ESP Ltd, an Edgo Company, has successfully installed a Baker Hughes ESP pump in Libya's Bouri field, the first successful ESP pump installation in the field after ten years.

The complex installation was successfully commissioned using the highest specification equipment to achieve the longest run life for the ESP string. The ESP was connected to a surface medium voltage drive to better control the ESP and fine-tune the production rate. The job was conducted by six, highly trained field specialists that ESP Ltd flew in to work on the installation.

The installation was the first of three that ESP Ltd will conduct in the Bouri field as part of a tender won by the company in March 2019. Following the first successful commission, the ESP team has now worked on a second well in the field.

The wells worked on by ESP Ltd are spread across two platforms in the Bouri field, located in the Mediterranean Sea around 80kms north of the Libyan coast. The field is operated by ENI, in partnership with the National Oil Company with Mellitah Oil and Gas operating the field.

Camco Delivers New Firsts in Libya

Working with its partner TGT Oilfield Services DMCC (TGT), Camco Oilfield Services has delivered several firsts in Libya in recent months.



Camco is believed to be one of the first oilfield service companies to perform a noise logging job in Libya and introduce noise and leak detection technology to all NOC companies. Dealing with one of the most complicated cases they had faced, Camco-TGT successfully performed noise logging on a sixty-year-old well which was exhibiting a surface leak and provided the client with a complete technical solution to solve the problem. Following the success of the operation, the client has asked Camco-TGT to perform further noise logging on other wells.

Camco has also performed its first corrosion logging job in Libya, on a well in the Chadar field, using TGT's impulse tools. The age of the well coupled with the symptoms suggested a complex multi-barrier failure scenario that needed to be diagnosed quickly and accurately so that the well could be secured safely.

Camco and the customer selected TGT's Multi Seal Integrity diagnostic product to locate the source of pressure and associated flow-paths. Multi Seal Integrity diagnostics are delivered using TGT's proprietary True Integrity system, leveraging a combination of key technology platforms applied by diagnostic experts using a methodical workflow.

The True Integrity system successfully identified the sources of pressure and revealed a highly complex geometry of interconnected flow-paths between several formation layers and through multiple tube and cement barriers. Equipped with a complete diagnosis, the client was able to design and execute an appropriate plugging and abandonment program to secure the well permanently, eliminating any further risk to people and the planet.

Due to the complicated nature of the diagnosis and Camco's successful performance, the client will be using this success story as a case study in the future.

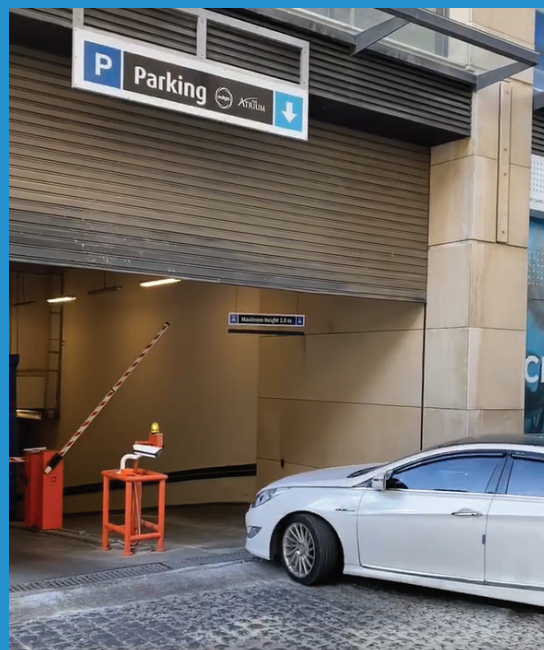

The Edgo Atrium Installs State of the Art Technology

The Edgo Atrium Building (EAB), a landmark green building in the heart of the Abdali district of downtown Amman, has installed state of the art technology to improve security and efficiency for the building's tenants. Through the introduction of Artificial Intelligences (AI), the EAB is forging ahead with frictionless tenant experiences as a core component of the property. Consistently evolving through tenant feedback, the EAB is rolling out human centered design solutions augmented by AI.

License Plate Recognition, License Plate Recognition (LPR) has been installed in the EAB's underground car park, which offers car parking space over four basement floors. Image processing technology has been introduced to identify vehicles by their license plates, keeping an image record of any vehicle entering the building in order to enhance security. The new LPR system will allow tenants with pre-authorized vehicles to access the car park more quickly and efficiently.



Additionally, a facial recognition system has been installed in the lobby of the EAB to further improve security and ease of access to the building.

The Edgo Atrium offers the latest in sustainable and functional commercial and retail space in the heart of the Abdali district in downtown Amman. The property's 14,343 m² leasable area is distributed over one retail floor and seven floors of commercial space serviced by high-speed elevators. The Edgo Atrium is one of only a handful of buildings in Jordan to be awarded the Gold LEED certification for the green working environment it offers its tenants. Along with functional, quality reception and communal areas, the property boasts the SkyGarden, an open-air roof terrace with panoramic views of the Amman skyline, fully equipped with lounge seating and BBQ facilities.

Edgo VC Announces Investment in Tech-Enabled Lender

Edgo VC, the venture capital arm of Edgo, has announced an investment in technology-enabled lender liwwa. A recent equity round led by FMO, the Dutch Entrepreneurial Development Bank, has seen liwwa raise a total of US\$ 6 million from a range of investors including



Edgo VC, 500 Startups, Chris Larsen, EFG-EV and Wamda.

The equity round marks liwwa's expansion into Egypt, a market characterized by high growth and limited access to capital.

liwwa is a tech-enabled lender focused on providing capital to small businesses in Jordan and Egypt. The company has provided roughly \$40 million in debt to qualifying SMEs. liwwa employs technology across its operation to deliver loans of up to \$100,000 to qualifying borrowers in a few days. The company's proprietary credit models have yielded exceptional portfolio quality with arrears of roughly 2.7%. liwwa's debt marketplace – accessible at www.liwwa.com – has allowed the company to sell investments to hundreds of retail investors in MENA.

Edgo VC serves as the venture capital arm of Edgo under which the group's direct and indirect venture capital activities are consolidated. Edgo VC takes an opportunistic approach to venture capital investing and is sector, stage, and region agnostic.

Omar M Masri Gives Keynote Speech at Silk Road Summit in China

Group managing director, Omar M Masri attended the annual Silk Road Chamber of International Commerce (SRCIC) summit in Xi'an, China late last year.

The conference, held at the Paradise Resort, Xi'an was opened by Lu Jianzhong, chairman of the SRCIC. Two full days of presentations and forums followed with subjects covered including the Silk Road Development Fund and the sustainable development of the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI), a global development strategy to promote the renaissance of the Silk Road, an ancient network of trade routes connecting East and West.

On the second day of the conference, Omar M Masri gave the keynote speech during a forum about Belt and Road Financing and Pragmatic Cooperation. During the speech Mr Masri spoke of the importance of the Public Private Partnership (PPP) model to the Belt and Road Initiative and his experience of successful PPP projects, including the Build Operate Transfer (BOT) project at Queen Alia Airport in Amman, Jordan.



In his speech, Omar M Masri said:

“Pragmatically speaking, I believe that the PPP model will be the new normal of project financing for BRI, given the squeeze on government finances, which has forced a rethink of how projects and public services are paid and funded, and how they reform the economic model in the region to be more sustainable, productive, and efficient.



For increased scale and speed of BRI, I would encourage Chinese banks to seriously consider investing in a few, select group of Middle East and North Africa (MENA) banks. Equity investments in the MENA banking sector would provide China with a seat at the table, alongside the regional decision makers in the private sector. By injecting some capital, technical know-how and support, the Chinese banks would unlock private pools of capital in MENA for the purpose enabling the funding environment for BRI PPPs.”

During the conference, Stjepan Mesic, the former president of Croatia was given the SRCIC Lifetime Achievement award and David Saganelidze, chairman of the Partnership Fund of Georgia and Aliaksandr Yarashenka, head of the administration of the Great Stone Industrial Park, were both honored with the SRCIC outstanding leadership award.

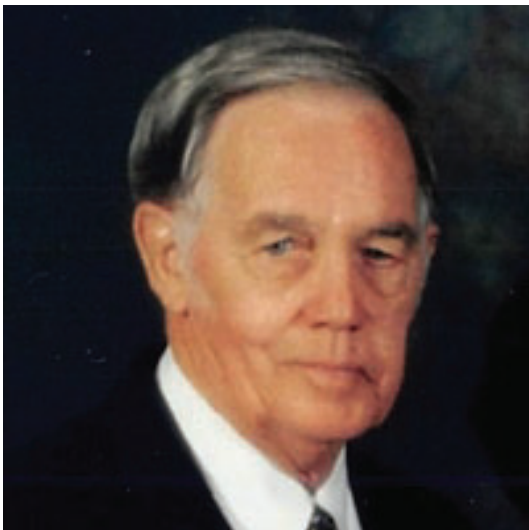
Edgo Oman Awarded Valued Supplier Status

George Sallee

It was with great sadness that we learned of the passing of George Sallee, who worked alongside the Edgo chairman Munib Masri in the early days of Edgo, securing the company's relationship with Reda, which continues to this day.

George graduated from A+M University with a degree in Geology and Petroleum Engineering in 1955 and began working as an operations

manager for Brae Burn Petroleum in Oklahoma, Texas and New Mexico. In 1964, he joined the Reda pump company in Bartlesville, Oklahoma. It was at Reda that George took a gamble in the 1970s on working with Edgo, after Munib R Masri convinced George to put his faith in Edgo and its capabilities. Mr. Masri fulfilled his promise and Edgo delivered resounding successes to Reda in the Middle East and Africa of which George was extremely proud.

George was recognized as one of the foremost leaders in the international oil services community. He was well respected throughout the industry and around the world, meeting, partnering, and negotiating with heads of state. George's simple philosophy was, "If a person simply respects others, respects what they have, and identifies himself as being a visitor in their country, he can function almost anywhere in the world." After devoting 28 years of employment to Reda Pump Company, George retired in 1992.

Launching the fellowships, Munib R Masri said:

"I am truly honored to launch the Munib and Angela Masri Graduate fellowship which will support graduate students from accredited regional universities to study at the prestigious Jackson School of Geosciences.

"The intent of my gift is to make a hundred-year commitment to The University of Texas at Austin and to graduate students to support training and research on water, land use, energy, climate, and environmental resilience, with an eye toward

investigating how these critical resources interact as a system, so that the effects of human activities on habitat, water and energy resources and climate can be accurately predicted, and the management of natural resources can be optimized while maintaining a diverse and vital environment.

"On the geologic time scale, 100 years is nothing, but for humanity the next 100 years are critical. It is my hope that my commitment will make it possible for scholars to identify solutions to some of our most difficult challenges which have world-wide implications."

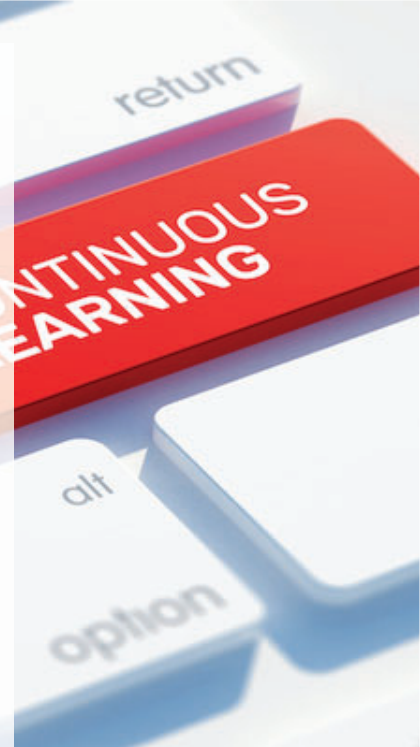

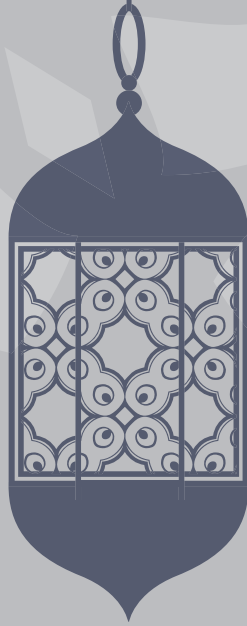
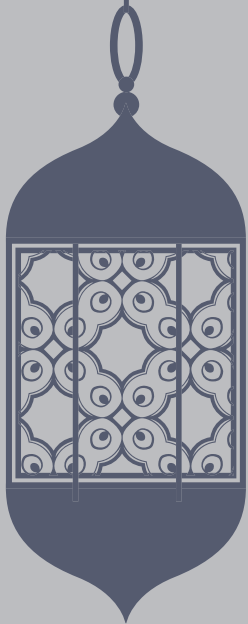
I believe that there is always a light at the end of the tunnel; my thesis defence was planned to be a face-to-face one (however, due to COVID-19 and travel restrictions), it happened online on April 22nd, during the curfew.

What makes me so proud of this achievement is that I'm the first person from Jordan to graduate from this program from 17 cohorts.
